

In July 2006 the Museum opened to the visitors a new permanent exhibition called “The Coach House”. The exhibition is on display in a former firewood depot, refurbished and adapted for expository needs. The Coach House is located near the castle parking place. The exhibition encompasses 16 vintage horse-drawn vehicles produced between 1900 and 1939. Fifteen vehicles come from a private collection of Jan Wzorek from Kielecczyzna region.

The visitors have the opportunity to view among others the commodities produced by factories such as Fabryka Pojazdów, Bryczek i Sań Braci F.I.K. Buraków (The F.I.K. Burak Brothers Vehicle, Britzka and Sleigh Factory) in Kielce, Szydłowska Fabryka Bryczek Braci Węgrzeckich (the Węgrzeccy Brothers Szydłowska Factory of Britzkas), Ludwig Nobel St. Petersburg factory or the excellent Rentl’s factory from Warsaw.

Moreover, you can find here one of a kind examples of horse-drawn vehicles from the area of former Eastern Borderlands known as “czortopchajka” or “bałagułka”. Apart from the vehicles from the collection of Jan Wzorek the castle coach house houses also a special stroll model of sledge from the collection of Castle Museum Complex in Niedzica. The sledge is about 100 years old and come from the (non-existing) castellum located in Łapsze Niżne.

In addition, the interior of the Coach House is complemented by various types of travel accessories, including harnesses, trunks, bags and suitcases.
